Jack's Shack ...




FODV received notification from the Nannup shire that Jack's Shack sat partially in the Shire's reserve but they did not foresee any issues should the FODV conserve/preserve the shack to be made available to the public at some time in the future.

We have asked for support from the Department of Lands to commission a Conservation Management Strategy report to give guidance on Jack's Shack and the surrounding area. We are currently awaiting a response and will keep you posted of any developments.


